#### Oak Class News

We have been enjoying many of the wonderful works of our author of the term - 'Michael Rosen'. As well as our favourite 'We're going on a Bear Hunt' we have been listening to and learning some of his many short stories and poems. We have then been carefully listening for the rhyming words and seeing if we can make some of our own rhyming pairs up.

This term we were very lucky to be gifted with a free class set of recorders from the Leicestershire Schools Music Service and have started to learn how to hold and use it properly. All the children have loved experimenting with sound and music!

In art the children have been looking carefully at the features of different landscape artwork - identifying how different colours are used according to the season or time of day. They have then been working on their own wonderful landscape artwork.

After learning how to follow and create our own sequence of clear instructions, the children used these to make a jam sandwich – the final instruction 'finally, eat the sandwich' was greatly enjoyed!



#### Willow Class News

Willow Class have been working really hard in all areas of the curriculim. We shared a book and reflected on how we can help save our planet. In class discussions, we thought it would be a good idea to recycle packaging and talked about the 'Wombles Assesmbly' too.
